


The Impact of Your Support in 2019

Keeping Families Close in the House

Our House was home to 730 families last year. Families travelled from across Ontario, Canada or even internationally. Each family holds a powerful desire – to remain close to their sick child.

Without you, they would also be facing a financial crisis. The cost of taking time off work and living in a new city adds up quickly. You may recall Ella, a 15-year-old who battled cancer last year. She said,



"Without the House, my parents could not have been away from their jobs for as long as they have been.

With over 20 engaging programs, your gift allowed families to connect and have some fun. Here are a few examples from 2019:

- RMHC Toronto School celebrated its 15th anniversary and served 73 patients and siblings – our highest enrollment yet.
- RMHC Toronto Camp became year-round. In addition to the summer, Camp is now available over March Break, Christmas holidays and even P.A. days.
- Pascal Siakam visited the House with the Raptors Dance Pack and championship trophy.
- In December, our Tranquility Garden was transformed into a winter wonderland complete with music, dancing, poutine and hot chocolate.



Keeping Families Close in the Family Rooms

Our seven Family Rooms, located in five hospitals, served 4,620 families last year. Perhaps you remember the story of baby Hudson? He was given a 1% chance of living when he was born.

Thanks to you, his parents, Joe and Tiffany were able to navigate their roller coaster of emotions over 10 long months in the Family Room.



Today, Hudson is a curious one-and-a-half-year-old who loves playing outdoors.

Although he still bears physical scars, he has a bright future ahead of him.

When reflecting back on how they made it through, Joe and Tiffany said,
