Keeping seriously ill children and their families together to improve their health and well-being.

#### **Our Vision**

To be a leader in providing a family-focused environment and innovative support services to seriously ill children and their families.

RMHC Toronto is committed to family-centred care and to ensuring all families feel welcome. We are taking active steps to building greater Indigenous inclusion.

The RMHC Toronto House is located in Tkaronto, now known as Toronto, which in Mohawk means 'where the trees are standing in the water'. Tkaronto is covered under Treaty #13 and the Williams Treaties. It is the traditional territories of many First Peoples, including the Mississaugas of the Credit, the Anishnaabe, the Chippewa, the Haudenosaunee, and the Wendat peoples. Today, Toronto is home to many First Nations, Inuit and Métis people from across Turtle Island and we are grateful to have the opportunity to work and serve families on this territory.

## You're giving the Thomsons a place like HOME to sleep in at night, a space to spend time as a family.

I never expected my sweet baby Bella to be born with not one, but three rare medical conditions! There is no children's hospital in our hometown of Swift Current, SK, so we had to travel for Bella's treatment.

Bella was in hospital for 2 whole years before we could bring her home for the first time since she was born. Currently at age 10, Bella's been in hospital over 1000 nights.

Bella still needs frequent hospital care, and we travel to SickKids Hospital quite a lot. In fact, RMHC has been a part of our lives for ten years - and counting!

I honestly don't know what I'd do without it. The Meals from the Heart program provides nutritious meals for Bella and I after a long day in hospital.

It gives me so much comfort to sleep at RMHC Toronto, knowing I am close by the hospital. So much better than a hotel, which feels isolating and scary. It helps to connect with other families who are going through the same


experience. Even just having a volunteer at the front desk that I can talk to at any time if I'm feeling anxious is so helpful to me.

My husband Lyle usually stays in Swift Current working and looking after our son Waylon. But it's such a blessing when they can travel to see us and stay at RMHC Toronto. It means so much to spend those moments together as a family.

# You gave the Yokens a **ROOM** to take a break while in hospital, to find moments of peace and calm amidst the chaos.

Tommy took ill very suddenly. Because he was a healthy, active child, we didn't expect to be living at the hospital for 11 days. We went from living a normal life to being rushed to the ER. We showed up at the hospital without anything (not even clothes, toothbrush, or a phone charger!).

The Family Room provided the necessities that we didn't have time to gather beforehand.

Having a space to relax in the hospital was critical. My son was touch and go at some points and I needed to be able to get to him as soon as possible. At the Family Room the doctors could get in touch with me and I could be right there to support my son.

The second I walked through the doors of the Family Room... it felt like a home and not a hospital. It was quiet and private. It felt like I had stepped into a different world. And it was the break that I really, really needed but hadn't been able to take. In this situation everyone asks, how can I help you, what can I do, can I bring you food or watch your kid? We had great support during that time, but the Family Room is the one thing that truly helped me.

THANK YOU. The Family Room was our rock of stability and provided a small sanctuary during the worst time in our lives. This is why it is so important to us to give back to RMHC Toronto.

It can be challenging for any of us to cook a healthy meal after a long day. You can imagine how tough it is for parents who spend every waking hour in hospital with their child who is seriously ill.

The demand for RMHC Toronto's meal programs has skyrocketed. In the past year alone, we've provided 44% more meals than the previous vear!

#### THANK YOU for making sure this vital program continues to be there for families in need.

With your help, families have access to three chef-prepared dinners each week, and lunches twice a month. They can grab food and cook it in our kitchen at any time. You also help stock our pantry with "grab and go" items and a "help yourself" fridge with pre-made food.

You provide more than food to these families. You offer comfort, nourishment, and convenience during an incredibly turbulent time. Plus, you provide significant relief for families who experience financial strain trying to feed their family while away from home.

# Thanks to you... Children have a place to keep up with their schooling.

Ronald McDonald House Charities (RMHC) Toronto School is a private school, recognized by the Ministry of Education, for patients and their siblings who are staying at the House. Our School compassionately provides a unique, student-centred, learning environment to facilitate academic, emotional and social success.

Students in K to Gr. 8 can attend in-person classes. Tutoring sessions are available for secondary students and children who can't attend full-days. Preschool children receive weekly activity bags to explore with parents.

These include programs designed to foster social and emotional well-being, like:


- Coffee Talk a casual time for caregivers to unwind and socialize while kids have fun doing a supervised activity.
- Circle Time toddler-aged kids can sing songs, listen to stories and play.
- · PAWS children and families get to interact with specially trained dogs.

As well as programs designed to promote fun and creativity:

- Artwork & Woodworking families participate in arts and crafts or woodworking projects.
- · Books N' Crafts children can listen to a story and create a craft based on the book.
- Family Dances DJ and party snacks and dancin' grooves!

This drastically improves families' social and emotional well-being. ### Lou's Room: A grateful family and the power of community

Baby Elouise, affectionately known as "Lou" contracted COVID19 just a few months after her birth. Her condition deteriorated to the point that she needed a bone marrow transplant at SickKids. Lou's family stayed at RMHC Toronto for 70 days.

During their stay, Lou's family found themselves surrounded by love and compassion from their community. Some friends and family stepped up to donate blood to support Lou's transfusions. They formed a group called "Lou's Crew" to rally behind her.

Other friends and family who were unable to donate blood still wanted to contribute. Inspired by Stephanie's grandmother, who had been an active volunteer and supporter of RMHC Toronto for many years, the idea of the "Lou's Room" fundraiser was born.

The initial goal of the fundraiser was to support the family's stay at RMHC Toronto and contribute to the organization. Friends, family, coworkers, and even local hockey teams came together - not just financially but also with well wishes and encouragement.






